



All meetings are held in the Professional Learning Community Center of the Senator Eugene Levy/Dr. Jack R. Anderson Education Center, 105 S. Madison Ave., Spring Valley, and begin at 7:30 p.m., unless otherwise announced. Special meetings may be called as necessary, and will be announced on the District's website.

The Board also conducts study sessions to discuss district-related matters without taking formal action. Additionally, public hearings and other informational meetings are held as needed, as are those of the Board's various committees. The Board may conduct an executive session during a scheduled meeting to discuss personnel items, negotiations, real estate, litigation and other matters as allowed by law.

SCHOOL BUDGET VOTE AND BOARD OF EDUCATION ELECTIONS

All school budgets and bond issues must be approved by the voters of the East Ramapo Central School District. Qualifications for voters are prescribed by New York State law.

To vote, a person must be:

- a citizen of the United States;
- a resident of the School District for at least 30 days;
- 18 years of age or older;
- Personally registered for School District Elections or registered for General Elections with Rockland County.

If you have recently moved into the district and are not registered for school district elections, but have voted in general elections, you must file a change of address with the Board of Elections to be eligible to vote in a general election.

Residents may come to the District Clerk's office at 105 South Madison Ave, Spring Valley, NY, between 8:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. on any business day up to five days prior to the school district vote to register in person

The 2017 School Budget Vote and Election will be held on May 16, 2017.

When School Is In Session... Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act

Notification of Rights Under the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA)

FERPA is a federal law designed to protect the privacy of student records. The law gives parents, guardians and students over 18 years of age (referred to in the law as "eligible students") the following rights:

- The right to inspect and review the student's education records within 45 days of the day the school district receives a request for access.
 Parents, guardians or eligible students should submit to the building principal a written request that identifies the records they wish to inspect.
 The principal will make arrangements for access and notify the parent or eligible student of the time and place where the records may be inspected.
- 2. The right to request the amendment of the student's education records that the parent or eligible student believes are inaccurate or misleading. Parents, guardians or eligible students may ask the district to amend a record that they believe is inaccurate or misleading by writing the principal, clearly identifying the part of the record they want changed, and specifying why it is inaccurate or misleading. If the school district decides not to amend the record as requested by the parent, guardian or eligible student, the district will notify the parent, guardian or eligible student of the decision and advise them of their right to a hearing regarding the request for amendment. Additional information regarding the hearing procedures will be provided to the parent, guardian or eligible student when notified of the right to a hearing.
- 3. The right to consent to disclosure of personally identifiable information contained in the student's education records, except to the extent that FERPA authorizes disclosure without consent. One exception which permits disclosure without consent is disclosure to

school officials with legitimate educational interests. A school official is a person employed by the district as an administrator, supervisor, instructor, or support staff member (including health or medical staff and law enforcement unit personnel); a person serving on the school board; a person or company with whom the school district has contracted to perform a special task (such as an attorney, auditor, medical consultant, or therapist); or a parent or student serving on an official committee, such as a disciplinary or grievance committee, or assisting another school official in performing his tasks. A school official has a legitimate educational interest if the official needs to review an education record in order to fulfill his professional responsibility. Upon request, the school district discloses education records without consent to officials of another school district in which a student seeks or intends to enroll.

Directory Information

In addition to the rights outlined above, FERPA also gives the school district the option of designating certain categories of student information as "directory information." Directory information is limited to a student's name, date and place of birth, participation in school activities or sports, weight and height if a member of an athletic team, dates of attendance, degrees and awards received, and most recent school attended

The purpose of directory information is to allow the school district to include this type of information from your child's education records in certain school publications. Some examples would be a playbill showing your student's role in a drama production; annual yearbook; honor roll or other recognition lists; graduation programs; sports activity sheets such as for wrestling, showing weight and height of team members.

Directory information is information that is generally not considered harmful or an invasion of privacy if released and may be disclosed to outside organizations without a parent's prior written consent. Outside organizations include, but are not limited to, companies that manufacture class rings or publish yearbooks.

You may object to the release of any or all of this directory information. If we do not receive a written objection, we will be authorized to release this information without your consent.

Disclosure to Military Recruiters

Pursuant to the No Child Left Behind, the school district must disclose to military recruiters and institutions of higher learning, upon request, the names, addresses, and telephone numbers of high school students.

The District must also notify parents of their right, and the right of their child, to request that the District not release such information without prior written parental consent. Parents wishing to exercise their option to withhold their consent to the release of the above information to military recruiters and institutions of higher learning must sign and return a notification to the building principal by October 1 of the current school year.

K-12 ALERTS

K-12 Alerts is an automated telephone, e-mail and text messaging service that the District uses to keep parents, community members and staff rapidly informed about emergency situations and important announcements. K-12 Alerts will be sent to announce weather related or other school closings, and to notify parents of sex-offenders.

Parents and Guardians who are interested in receiving notifications via home or work e-mail and/or text messaging to their cell phone, must register by filling out a simple enrollment form on the East Ramapo Central School District website.

As always, student telephone and emergency contact information is updated by calling your child's school and speaking with the secretary. Telephone numbers must be kept current so we may better support you and your children.

Telephone messages will only be sent to the home phone numbers that are on file with your child's school. The schools will not be collecting email or cell phone text messaging

Please do not hesitate to contact your school if you have questions regarding this new service.

COMMUNICATIONS FROM PARENTS

Parents will from time to time have inquiries about school matters. Inquiries should be taken first to those persons who are closest to the subject. This normally means discussing the matter with the appropriate teacher.

Appointments can be made by calling the school's general office. After talking with the teacher, a parent may wish to discuss the concern with a guidance counselor or other member of the pupil personnel team. If the matter is not resolved, the parent may then contact the principal or other member of the school's administrative team. If the matter is still not resolved, you may wish to bring the concern to a central office administrator.

This administrator will ask for a summary of previous discussions held with school personnel in relation to the concern. The matter will be investigated and findings and conclusions will be reported to the individual concerned. A resident always has the right to appeal to the Board of Education. However, even in matters related to acts of the Board itself, it is proper to present any matter first to the superintendent of schools.

Admission & Immunizations

INTRODUCTION

All children who meet the age and residency requirements established by state law have the right to attend school whether they are U.S. citizens, documented aliens, or undocumented immigrant

REGISTRATION REQUIREMENT CHECKLIST

The child's initial enrollment will occur on the next school day after the request for enrollment is made, or as soon thereafter as practicable. However, if the District is able to determine nonresidency from documentation provided on the day of the initial request, the child will not be enrolled. Following the request for enrollment, you will have 3 business days to present proof of custody, residency, and age of the student using the kinds of documentation listed below. If you do not present the required proof, your child will not be granted final registration in the District.

Proof of Age: must be certified copy

- Certified transcript of birth, including foreign birth certificate (with seal); or
- Religious Certificate (Baptismal or Bris Certificate).

If neither of the above are available:

• Passport (including foreign passport) showing the date of birth of the minor.

If none of the above-listed documentation is available, the following will be considered:

- Permanent resident/Green Card:
- Official driver's license;
- State-or other government-issued ID:
- School photo ID with date of birth;
- Consulate identification card;
- Hospital or health records (in New York City, Hospital Birth Records);
- Military dependent ID card;
- Documents issued by federal, state or local agencies;
- Court orders or court-issued documents;
- Native American tribal document:
- Record(s) from non-profit international aid agencies and voluntary agencies (VOLAGS).

Other than birth certificates, religious certificates and passports, documentation of age must have been in existence two years or more.

Proof of Immunization: You have thirty (30) days to submit to the school nurse the month, date and year of New York State immunizations signed by a doctor or clinic. If documentation of immunization is not obtained after this period, the student may be excluded from school until documentation/immunization is obtained. For a list of required immunizations, see the Central Registration page on the District website: www.ercsd.org.

Proof of Parental Identification: The parent/guardian/person in parental relation MUST be present at time of registration and provide valid identification such as:

- · Driver's license:
- Government Issued Photo ID;
- DSS-299.

Proof of Residency: You must provide at least one form of proof of residency from list A or B. In addition, please provide at least one other document from list C, below.

A. Homeowner/Condominium owner

- Mortgage statement;
- Deed; or
- Closing Papers

B. Renter/Tenant

- Lease:
- Affidavit or unsworn statement by landlord;
- Affidavit or unsworn statement by owner or tenant from whom parent/person in parental relation leases or shares property; or
- Statement by any other party establishing parent(s)'/person in parental relations' physical presence in the District.

C. Other Documentation of Residency

In addition to providing at least one item from list A or B above, please provide at least one additional document demonstrating residency if available. Below is a list of examples of documentation that may be used. Please note that this list is intended only to provide examples of documentation that may be relevant to residency determinations. The District will consider other kinds of documentation. The list below is not intended to be exhaustive, nor is it a list of required documentation.

- Pay stub;
- Income tax form:
- Utility (such as gas/electric/oil bill, e.g., Orange & Rockland);
- Other bills (such as water bill (e.g., United Water), home telephone bill (e.g., Verizon, Optimum, etc.), cable TV/Digital TV bill (e. g., Cablevision, Direct TV, etc.) or Broadband/Internet service provider bill (e. g., Verizon, AOL, etc.);
- Membership documents (e. g., library cards) based upon residency;
- Voter registration document(s

- Documents issued by Federal, State or local agencies (e. g., local social service agency, Federal Office of Refugee Resettlement); or
- Evidence of custody of the child, including but not limited to judicial custody orders or guardianship papers.

Please note: The District will be flexible in considering different kinds of documentation of residency. Any documentation you present will be considered. However, the District has found the following kinds of documents to be less reliable proof of residency: checkbooks; bank statements; credit card statements; car insurance statements/cards; cellular telephone bills; car notes or loan statements (other than mortgage loans)

D. Proof of Parental Relationship/Custody

- An affidavit of the parent(s) or person(s) in parental relation indicating either: (1) that they are the parent(s) with whom the child lawfully resides; or (2) that they are the person(s) in parental relation to the child, over whom they have total and permanent custody and control, and describing how they obtained total and permanent custody and control, whether through guardianship or otherwise
- Documentation indicating that the child resides with a sponsor with whom the child has been placed by a Federal agency;
- Guardianship document or custody order signed by a Judge or Court Officer (This specific documentation is not required, but is one form of proof of the parental relationship that

Additional Documents

Please submit any previous school records, transcripts, or any other relevant documents regarding your child's education, as these will assist us in placing your child in the proper grade and classes.

Special Education/Pupil Services

East Ramapo Central School District is committed to making sure all students receive a quality education that fits within the framework of their individual needs. The Office of Special Student Services specially designs instruction, services and programs to help meet the unique needs of students with disabilities.

The district provides a full range of special education services including:

- Speech and audiology
- Psychological services
- Physical therapy
- Occupational therapy
- Consultant teacher services
- Resource room services to provide supplemental instruction
- Transitional support services
- Integrated class services
- Day treatment
- Residential services
- Home or hospital instruction

Committee on Special Education (CSE)

All special education placements are determined by the Committee on Special Education, the Subcommittee on Special Education and the Committee on Preschool Special Education. Based on mandated documents and educational reports, the CSE will determine if a disability exists and, if so, will recommend appropriate services, program and placement.

These committees, in conjunction with parents and teachers, help develop Individual Education Programs (IEPs) for each school-age or preschool-age pupil with a disability on an annual basis.

The IEPs include information about the unique learning needs of each student, such as learning rate, levels of social and physical development and the students' management needs. The document also includes annual goals and short-term objectives in academic, social and other areas for the student's

school year. The IEP will serve as a curriculum plan of action and a source of evaluation for the student's progress during an entire school year.

Related services can be recommended as part of a total special education program or as a component of a general education program. If these programs are not able to provide the appropriate support for a student, then placements can be recommended for out-of-district programs, which may include classes in neighboring school districts, Board Of Cooperative Education Services (BOCES) programs, State approved day school classes, or State approved residential programs. Placements are reviewed annually, and appropriate recommendations are made for each student.

The CSE comprises the following members: a general education teacher (if the student is, or may be, participating in the general education environment), at least one special education teacher, a representative of the School District knowledgeable about the general curriculum and availability of resources, a staff member who can interpret the instructional implications of the evaluation results, a parent, and a school psychologist, speech teacher, occupational therapist, or physical therapist as deemed necessary.

Procedures for the CSE review are thoroughly explained to parents by any one of the following administrative and staff members: building psychologist, case manager, building principal, Assistant Superintendent for Special Education, Special Education Instructional Supervisors, and/or guidance counselors at the secondary level.

Committee on Preschool Special Education (CPSE)

The School District is responsible for ensuring the provision of evaluations and special education services and/or programs to eligible preschool children. A child must be classified by the CPSE as a preschooler with a disability in order to receive services.

Parents who have concerns about their preschool child's development should contact the CPSE Chairpersons, Phyllis Levy, Ilene Balavram, and Elyse Fields at 577-6078.

A meeting will be scheduled to discuss the specific procedures to follow and to assist with the completion of paperwork. The parents have the right to select, from an approved list, the evaluator of their child. Following the evaluation, a Committee on Preschool Special Education meeting will occur and a recommendation will be made as to whether the child qualifies as a preschool student with a disability.

If services are warranted, the CPSE will make the recommendation at that meeting. The parents have the right, at any time during the process, in writing, to withdraw their request.

Once in a program, the child will be reviewed annually. When requested, the child could be referred to the District's CSE to be considered for classification and eligibility for services upon entry into kindergarten.

Case Management

The Case Management Office provides services to students who have been recommended by the school district for out-of-district placements. Once a student has been recommended for an out-of-district placement, the staff in Case Management assumes responsibility for overseeing the student's educational program. The Case Management Office conducts CSE meetings and annual reviews. The Case Management staff observes students in their school environments, meets with staff and parents as necessary and ensures students receive an appropriate education.

Individual Education Program (IEP)	The IEP states your child's classification, the type of program, specific special education and related services to be provided, duration of program (10 or 12 months), present levels of academic performance, any special needs for transportation, annual goals, and any special testing procedures or equipment to be used. The IEP must explain the extent, if any, to which your child will not participate in general education programs. Your child's classification, services, and program will be reviewed once a year by a subcommittee of the CSE/CPSE. This meeting is called an Annual Review. At any time, you may ask for a review of your child's IEP, classification, special education services and/or program by writing to the CSE/CPSE. Due Process Rights	If you disagree with any part of the recommendation of the IEP, you may make a written request for a resolution meeting, mediation meeting, or an impartial hearing. LOTE REQUIREMENT

- (a) Students who complete Checkpoint A and two credits in a single language other than English no later than the end of grade 8 must pass the second language proficiency examination in order to earn one credit toward a high school diploma
- (b) Students taking a sequence of not less than 5 credits in career and technical education (GTE) or the arts may substitute such 5 credit sequence in place of the 3 credits in a language other than English (LOTE). To earn the advanced designation, the student must complete one of the following:
 - 1. LOTE (Language Other Than English) 3 credits
 - 2. CTE (Career and Technical Education) 5 credits
 - 3. The Arts (Dance, Music, Theater and Visual Arts) 5 credits

REGENTS EXAMINATION REQUIREMENTS FOR CERTAIN TRANSFER STUDENTS

The Regulations of the Commissioner of Education provide certain conditions under which an 11th or 12th grade transfer student who has not previously been home instructed and has not previously attended school in New York can earn a diploma without meeting the requirements for passing the Regents examination in global history and geography and passing a Regents examination in science. See your guidance counselor for further details.

APPEAL TO GRADUATE WITH A LOWER SCORE ON A REGENTS EXAMINATION

Beginning with students entering grade 9 in 2005, students who have taken and passed certain courses in preparation to take a Regents examination and have a 65 course average but whose highest score on the Regents examination is below but within three points of the 65 passing score may appeal to graduate with a local or Regents diploma using the lower score. Students who may be eligible for this consideration should speak with their guidance counselor for a list of eligibility requirements to further determine if they can pursue this appeal.

SAFETY NET FOR STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES

The Board of Regents, at their October 2012 meeting, approved the emergency adoption of an amendment to section 100.5 of the Regulations of the Commissioner of Education. These regulations, effective October 31, 2012, provide an additional option for a student with a disability to earn a local diploma through the use of a "compensatory option" if the student:

- 1. scores between 45-54⁴ on one or more of the five required Regents exams, other than the English language arts (ELA) or mathematics exam¹, but scores 65 or higher on one or more of the required Regents exams, in which case the lower score(s) can be compensated by the higher score(s)²; and
- 2. obtains a passing grade, that meets or exceeds the required passing grade by the school, for the course in the subject area of the Regents examination in which he or she received a score of 45-54; and
- 3. has a satisfactory attendance rate, in accordance with the district's or school's attendance policy, for the school year during which the student took the examination in which he or she received a score of 45-54, exclusive of excused absences; and
- 4. is not already using a passing score' on one or more Regents Competency Tests (RCTs) to graduate with a local diploma. (A student may not use the compensatory score option if he or she is using a passing score on one or more RCTs to graduate with a local diploma.)
- ¹ A score of at least 55 must be earned on both the ELA and mathematics exams.
- ²A score of 65 or higher on a single examination may not be used to compensate for more than one examination for which a score of 45-54 is earned.
- ³ Not used if RCT is used.
- ⁴ To qualify a student has to have a 65 on the ELA.

² Five required Regents exams plus at least one more in science, at least one more in math, and one in a language other than English. Students entering 9th grade in 2009 and beyond will be required to pass three Regents examinations in mathematics for an advanced Regents diploma.
